# General Practice Nursing: Core Skills for Professional Practice GPNC4001

This module is designed to support the development of General Practice Nurses (GPN's) working within a primary care role. The module will use a structured approach to build on the Registered Nurse's existing professional knowledge, skills and attributes to develop and enhance the specialist knowledge and clinical skills that are fundamental to the contemporary and diverse role of the General Practice Nurse e.g Tissue Viability, Public Health Screening Initiatives, Immunisations and Women's Health.

The module will reflect the integration of evidenced-based practice and clinical decision making. Emphasis will be based upon advanced communication skills, the acquisition of specialist clinical skills and an introduction to the complexities of the General Practice Nursing caseload in managing population health.

This module aims to support the General Practice Nurse to develop the necessary skills to successfully transition to master's level study and will actively promote the development of the self-directed and life-long learning.


